U.S. News & World Report rated more than 15,000 nursing homes throughout the country. *U.S. News & World Report* assesses facilities with separate evaluations for short-term rehabilitation and long-term care; only 19% of nursing homes in either category achieved a “High Performing” rating. Their evaluations include staffing levels, health outcomes and resident feedback, ensuring facilities meet federal standards and set a benchmark for exceptional care. Mabli credits the facility’s well-deserved recognition to its committed staff. She adds, “Our team members go above and beyond every day, bringing kindness, compassion, and professionalism to each resident interaction.
